The 83% of ROAR Attendees that persisted to Spring 2016

continued to be more successful than the 71% of Non-Attendees who persisted.

2015 ROAR + FYS Cohort Was Largely Pre-Core, Yet Succeeded

78% of FTFT students who attended ROAR *and* enrolled in (FYS) had *both* Math and English Scores below the "College Ready" level.

The ROAR + FYS Cohort performed better in

their first semester (Fall 2015) than *Non-ROAR Attendees*, and 79% of the ROAR + FYS Cohort persisted to Spring 2016, compared to 71% of Non-ROAR Attendees.
