The ADN-RN provides direct client care and assists in making decisions regarding plans of care for individuals and groups of healthy, ill and/or injured clients. The ADN-RN takes general support courses that are transferrable for a baccalaureate in nursing. A graduate of the program is conferred the Associate in Applied Science Degree and is eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) to obtain a nursing license.
