



2017 ROAR Update



- Implemented specialized ROAR sessions for A.D.N., Utility Lineman, & Barbering students
- 65% of incoming full-time students attended ROAR sessions.
- 31% of Academic-Major ROAR students enrolled in First-Year Seminar (LLS 1313) for Fall 2017.
- 73% of Academic-Major Pre-Core ROAR students enrolled in First-Year Seminar (LLS 1313) for Fall 2017

First-Year Seminar

- 467 Students enrolled in First-Year Seminar in the 2016-2017 year: 344 in Fall 2016 and 123 in Spring 2017
- All SLO's were successfully met
- 82% of Fall 2016 FYS students persisted to Spring 2017
- Fall FYS students completed, on average, 72% of their attempted hours
- 90 FYS students met Phi Theta Kappa GPA requirements, and 26 accepted membership.
- Thirteen new faculty were trained to teach First-Year Seminar

68% of 2016-2017 FYS Students were Pre-Core: Average Math ACT: 16.4 Average English ACT: 15.0
