

- How do you track your progress?




Where Are Our Areas of Growth?

Forrest County Center	23%	32%
Poplarville Campus	73%	65%
Hancock County Center	3%	2%

The FCC has disproportionately more **Transfer** and **Part-Time** students. These are traditionally the hardest students to convince to come to ROAR.

Transfer Students and ROAR

ROAR-Targeted Transfer Students transfer in fewer than 15 Hours. Among ROAR-Targeted Transfer Students, 57% transferred 8 or fewer hours



Anticipated ROAR Challenges
